

Florida Sea Grant/ Guy Harvey Fellowship



About

The Florida Sea Grant/Guy Harvey Fellowship, established in 2010 through a partnership between Florida Sea Grant (<https://www.flseagrants.org>) and the Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation (<https://ghof.org>), recognizes students at Florida universities whose research focuses on the biology, ecology, habitat or management of sustainable marine fisheries in Florida, including the protection of their critical habitats.

The Florida Sea Grant/Guy Harvey Fellowship has provided \$359,000 in financial support to 74 students at 11 different Florida universities.

Up to eight scholarships of \$5,000 each will be awarded to winners. The funds may be used to support equipment purchases, travel and other expenses incurred in the course of the student's respective research project.

Scholarship Eligibility & Selection

Eligibility Information:

The Florida Sea Grant/Guy Harvey Fellowship is eligible to undergraduate and graduate students who are enrolled full-time at Florida institutions of higher education who are conducting research related to the biology, ecology, habitat, or management of fish in Florida's marine environment. The awards program takes into consideration the breadth of research methods needed to effectively understand and sustainably manage marine fish. Students conducting field observations, experiments, modeling, or data synthesis are all eligible for this scholarship opportunity.

Application Requirements:

Applications must be filled out at <https://flseagrants.ifas.ufl.edu> by creating an account and selecting the Florida Sea Grant/Guy Harvey Fellowship. Complete applications include:

1. | A completed online application, including personal information about the applicant

2. | A current resume or CV (pdf)

6. | 1 signed Letter of Recommendation (pdf)

3. | A 2-page Career Statement (pdf)

7. | 1 signed Letter of Good Standing (pdf)

4. | A 2-page Description of Applicant's Research (pdf)

Selection of Finalists:

All application materials will be organized by the Florida Sea Grant College Program for submittal to a Foundation-appointed screening committee. The committee reviews applications and recommends top applicants. Final decisions will be made by July, and all applicants will be notified of the decision by August.
